**Resolution No. 25-146**

***Recognizing the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Yolo County Housing***

**WHEREAS**, the Housing Authority of the County of Yolo (also known as Yolo County Housing or “YCH”), established in 1950, has provided 75 years of safe, affordable housing and community development services for low-income families, seniors, people with disabilities, and migrant agricultural workers throughout Yolo County; and

**WHEREAS**, YCH’s first public housing developments - Yolano Village in Woodland and El Rio Villa I in Winters-opened in 1951, with additional developments in Esparto (1952), Yolo (1953), and expansions in the 1960s, 1980s, and 1990s, culminating in today’s 431 public housing units serving approximately 920 residents; and

**WHEREAS**, YCH currently administers 2,005 housing vouchers serving roughly 3,0000 participants, including Housing Choice, VASH, Mainstream, FUP, Fair Share, and Emergency Housing Vouchers; and

**WHEREAS**, YCH also operates three migrant centers in Dixon, Madison, and Davis providing 232 seasonal units that serve approximately 831 agricultural workers and their families; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1999, YCH established its nonprofit affiliate, New Hope Community Development Corporation (New Hope CDC), to expand affordable housing opportunities; including the 2002 acquisition of Cottonwood Meadows and its role in supporting multiple affordable communities throughout Woodland, Davis, and West Sacramento; and

**WHEREAS**, YCH and New Hope CDC now own, operate, and manage numerous affordable housing communities serving approximately 450 individuals, and continue to provide supportive services that promote stability and self-sufficiency for residents across Yolo County; and

**WHEREAS**, the dedication of past and present Commissioners, Executive Directors, staff, and volunteers has been essential to YCH’s lasting impact and mission.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Yolo County Board of Supervisors congratulates Yolo County Housing on its 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary and honors its decades of service in providing safe, affordable homes and strengthening communities. With deep appreciation, we acknowledge its contributions to families, seniors, farm workers, and residents throughout Yolo County.
