

**YOLO COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION
RESOLUTION 2025 - 01**

Resolution Honoring Trini Campbell Cline

WHEREAS, Trini Campbell was appointed to the Yolo County Planning Commission by the County Board of Supervisors on January 24, 2017, and attended her first Planning Commission meeting as an At-Large Commissioner on March 9, 2017, serving as Planning Commissioner for almost eight years, including serving as Chair in 2018; and

WHEREAS, since her appointment, Trini attended upwards of 65 Planning Commission meetings, including remote meetings during the COVID pandemic in 2020, 2021, and 2022; and

WHEREAS, during her term, Trini showed a strong commitment to ensuring development projects were sound and reasonable fits for the community in which they locate, and that there was access to available water supply; and

WHEREAS, during Trini's term on the Planning Commission she participated in numerous significant County projects, including Zoning Code amendments in 2017 to address agri-tourism regulations; approval of a use permit to convert and remediate a salvage yard (Metro Auto Wrecking) into a self-storage facility; consideration of Williamson Act Guidelines; expansion of the Crew Winery; removal of three Specific Plan areas in the General Plan; extensions to the Development Agreement terms for E. Parker, Story, and Orciouli residential subdivisions in Esparto and amendments to modify the Orciouli and Story Tentative Subdivision Maps; public workshops in 2017 on the Cache Creek Area Plan (CCAP), Draft Yolo HCP/NCCP, and Cache Creek Parkway Plan; approval of numerous Tentative Parcel Maps and several projects in Esparto and Dunnigan; early discussions in 2017/2018 on the cannabis program (CLUO); approval of the Teichert Esparto and CEMEX dewatering projects; updates to the Habitat Mitigation Ordinance; 2019 Esparto Community Plan update; Bryte Landfill Remediation project; EIR scoping workshop for the CLUO in 2019, followed by numerous meetings to discuss/take final action and recommendation on the CLUO and EIR in 2020; approval of the Putah Creek Solar Energy project; 2020 Ban on Hemp Ordinance; Zoning Code update workshop in 2020; review of Field & Pond use permit; mining permit amendments for various gravel mining operations and Interim Management Plan for Syar; annual mining compliance reviews; 20-year update to the CCAP in 2019 and 10-year permit review of the CCAP in 2021; approval of the Hay Kingdom and Wilbur Ellis Use Permits; 6th Cycle Housing Element update in 2021; early review of the Gibson Solar Farm application in 2021 and approval in 2023; several meetings to review, deliberate, and take final action and recommendation on the Teichert-Shifler Mining Permit and Reclamation Plan in 2020/2021; Clark Pacific road abandonment request of County Road 100B; deliberations on the Campbell Use Permit to legalize unpermitted ancillary dwellings; Zoning Code amendments involving urban lot splits and changes to the telecommunication/solar energy facilities ordinances; historic landmark designation for the Barn at Utter Ranch and approval of the Old Sugar Mill use permit in Clarksburg; historic alteration permits for the French Residence and Samuel Carpenter Cottage; presentations on the Cache Creek Resources Management Plan (CCRMP), Drought and Groundwater Sustainability Plan, Valley Clean Energy (VCE), Agricultural Conservation Priority Plan, and Yolo County Historical Society; approvals of the first Cannabis Use Permits for existing licensees in 2023/2024; Pylman tentative map and variance approval; approval of the Dunnigan Truck and Travel Center; minor amendment to the Granite Capay Mining Permit and Reclamation Plan, among many others.

WHEREAS, Trini exhibited a tireless and thorough approach when reviewing and making decisions on discretionary applications, zoning ordinances, and updates to the General Plan; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Yolo County Planning Commission gives its heartfelt thanks to Trini Campbell Cline for her dedication to the communities, residents, and resources of Yolo County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Yolo County Planning Commission extends its well wishes to Trini as she embraces her retirement and commitment to family and special hobby interests.
