Public Comment – CR 41 Access and Emergency Evacuation Concerns

Property: 2189 Road 41, Rumsey (District 5)

At the **July 22, 2025 Board Meeting**, the **Yolo County Office of Emergency Services** stated with respect to **CR 41 between the gates**:

“The Yolo County Office of Emergency Services (OES) has determined that CR 41 currently may not serve as a suitable evacuation route. The road faces challenges such as infrequent maintenance, washouts during heavy rains, and obstructions from fallen trees and debris, which can compromise safe passage. Emergency evacuation plans are adaptable and will utilize the most secure and accessible routes available at the time.”

I appreciate the County’s acknowledgment that CR 41 may not reliably function as a safe evacuation route. I am raising this comment because **the conditions described by OES are directly compounded by the ongoing landslide and slope instability affecting my property at 2189 Road 41.**

Since 2023, the property has experienced progressive landslide failures resulting in the loss of driveway access, continued inland ground movement, and increasing instability adjacent to the roadway. These conditions further impair the reliability of CR 41 for **daily access, emergency response, and evacuation**, particularly during storm events when washouts and slope failures are most likely to occur simultaneously.

Given the County’s own determination that CR 41 may not be a suitable evacuation route, and the documented, continuing geologic instability affecting access along this corridor, I respectfully request that the Board ensure **coordinated review by Public Works, Flood Control, and the Office of Emergency Services** to evaluate current conditions and determine appropriate next steps.

This is not a theoretical concern. It is an **active and evolving safety issue** affecting residents in the CR 41 corridor, including the **2189 Road 41**, property. I am asking that the County’s prior OES findings be considered together with the documented landslide progression when assessing access, emergency planning, and hazard response in this area.
