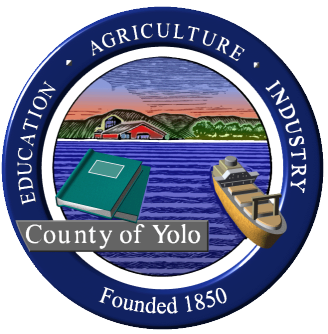

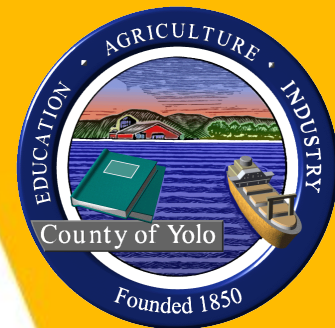
# 2025 Legislative Session Report



1. AB 59 (Aguiar-Curry) Authorize Reclamation district No. 108 to continue to exercise hydroelectric power authority after January 1, 2026. ***(Support– Chaptered)***
2. AB 346 (Nguyen) In-home supportive services: licensed health care professional certification. ***–(Support- Failed Deadline)***
3. AB 470 (McKinnor) Telephone corporations: carriers of last resort. ***(Oppose–Failed Deadline, may be acted upon Jan 2026)***
4. AB 762 (Irwin) Disposable, battery embedded vapor inhalation device: prohibition. ***(Support-1/15 Referred to Committee on Appropriations)***
5. AB 871 (Stefani) Mandated reporters of suspected financial abuse of an elder or dependent adult- ***(Support – 1/20, Ordered to third reading)***
6. AB 1288 (Addis) Registered Environmental Health specialists. ***(Support- Chaptered)***
7. SB 226 (Cabaldon) Community Colleges: territory transfers between districts. ***(Support- Failed deadline, may be acted upon Jan 2026)***
8. SB 239 (Arreguin) Open meetings: teleconferencing subsidiary body. ***(Support- Merged into SB 707)***

# 2026 Intergovernmental Advocacy Policy

- The 2026 Intergovernmental Advocacy Policy draft was put together in a collaborative process with County staff.
- This policy allows staff to provide swift advocacy in the 2026 state and federal legislative cycles.
- For 2026, staff is recommending the following Legislative Advocacy Priorities:
  1. Proactively engage on state budget issues to protect county revenue streams and prevent cost-shifting and/or unfunded mandates from the state.
  2. Engage state legislature in policy discussions to analyze measures that impact critical funding streams.
  3. Mitigate potential County impacts from recent federal and state budget actions such as, but not limited to, H.R. 1 to preserve current service levels.



## **Recommended Action:**

Consider adoption of the proposed 2026 Intergovernmental Advocacy Policy and Legislative Advocacy Priorities for Yolo County.
