**NOTICE TO BIDDERS

2026 PAVEMENT PRESERVATION PROJECT

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT: sealed proposals or bids will be received by the Yolo County Department of Community Services, Public Works Division, in Woodland, California for furnishing to said County all labor materials, equipment, transportation and services necessary to perform work identified in the Contract Documents as:

2026 PAVEMENT PRESERVATION PROJECT, WO 4646

Said proposal will be received at the Department of Community Services, Public Works Division, 292 West Beamer Street Woodland, CA 95695, **until 2:00 PM on April, 2, 2026**, and promptly thereafter all proposals received will be publicly opened, examined, and read aloud.

General work description, as detailed on the construction plan:

2026 PAVEMENT PRESERVATION PROJECT, Base Bid (the roads within and surrounding the Town of Dunnigan, CR 88, County Road 6, County Road 86, County Road 18C, County Road 101, and County Road 102 from the Woodland City Limit to County Road 17.

Work includes, but is not limited to: preserving survey monuments, traffic control, base repairs, pulverizing existing asphalt pavement, hot mix asphalt overlay, micro-surface, asphalt rubberized chip seal, installing curb ramps, shoulder backing, and striping.

Alternate Bid #1 (County Road 28H from County Road 102 to 1.10 mi east):

Optional work includes, but is not limited to traffic control, clearing and grubbing, milling and removing existing asphalt concrete surface, asphalt concrete paving, and striping. The optional work is for the County Road 28H segment, extending from County Road 102 (Sta. 0+44) to 1.1 mile east (Sta. 58+34).

No pre-bid meeting is scheduled for this project.

At the time this contract is awarded, the Contractor shall possess a Class A license. The Contractor must be properly licensed as a contractor from contract award through contract acceptance in accordance with Public Contract Code §20103.5.

The Dunnigan, CR 6, CR 86, CR 102, CR 101, and CR 18C segments are intended to be built as one project (Base Bid) The low bidder, for purposes of the award, shall be the responsive bidder offering the low aggregate amount for the base bid items and meeting all other bid submittal requirements. This solicitation includes one alternate bid (optional work), failure to bid on the alternate work will disqualify the bid. The County reserves the right to reject any or all bids or waive any informality or irregularity in any bid received or in the bidding process. If the County awards the contract, the award is made to the lowest responsible and responsive bidder.

This contract is subject to state contract nondiscrimination and compliance requirements pursuant to Government Code §12990.

It is the bidder's responsibility to register at <https://www.beaconbid.com/solicitations/yolo-county> to ensure notification of all addenda. It is the bidder's responsibility to arrange for printing services to obtain copies of the bid documents.

Inquiries or questions based on alleged patent ambiguity of the plans, specifications or estimate must be communicated as a bidder inquiry prior to bid opening. Any such inquiries or questions submitted after bid opening, will not be treated as a bid protest.

The successful bidder shall furnish a payment bond and a performance bond, each in the full amount of the contract price. These bonds shall be executed by a surety specified in California Code of Civil Procedure § 995.310.

The County of Yolo affirms that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, Disadvantaged Business Enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award.

Pursuant to Section 1773 of the Labor Code, the general prevailing wage rates in the county in which the work is to be done have been determined by the Director of the California Department of Industrial Relations. These wage rates are set forth in the General Prevailing Wage Rate Determinations for this project, available for review at the Yolo County Department of Community Services, Public Works Division, 292 West Beamer Street, Woodland, California and available from the California Department of Industrial Relations' internet web site at <http://www.dir.ca.gov/DLSR/PWD>. Future effective general prevailing wage rates which have been predetermined and are on file with the California Department of Industrial Relations are referenced but not printed in the General Prevailing Wage Rate Determinations. The bidder who is awarded the contract must post a copy of the prevailing wage rates at the job site. It shall be mandatory upon the successful bidder and its subcontractors to pay the prevailing rates and to comply with the applicable provisions of the California Labor Code.

At the time this contract is bid, the Contractor and subcontractors must be registered with the Department of Industrial Relations in conformance with Labor Code §§ 1725.5 and 1771.1 and if awarded a contract, the bidder and its subcontractors must maintain active registration for the duration of the project. This project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations.

Local Joint Apprenticeship Committee Participation Requirement: The County has adopted a Joint Apprenticeship Committee (JAC) participation requirement for certain public projects estimated to cost more than one-million dollars (\$1,000,000). A JAC means an apprenticeship program comprised of an equal number of employer and employee representatives approved by the State of California Division of Apprenticeship Standards. The County has also adopted a health care expenditure requirement. The County's JAC and health care

expenditure requirements are in addition to the apprenticeship and wage requirements of the Prevailing Wage Laws. More information regarding these County requirements is in the Special Provisions of the Contract Documents.

No bid will be received unless it is made on the proposal forms furnished by Yolo County Department of Community Services, Public Works Division. Copies or facsimiles of the bidder's completed and executed proposal forms submitted as a bid will be rejected. Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check, cashier's check, or bidder's bond made payable to Yolo County for an amount equal to at least ten percent (10%) of the amount of bid, such guaranty to be forfeited should the bidder to whom the contract is awarded fail to enter into the contract. If a bond is used, it must be signed by the bidder and by two signatories of an authorized surety company all as provided by law.

Seventy-Eight (78) working days are allowed for completion of the work.

All bids will be compared using the Engineer's Estimate of the quantities of work on the Bid Item List. For the purposes of bonding, the engineer's estimate for the base bid work is in the range of \$4.5 to \$5.5 million.
