Resolution No. 26-38

Proclaiming April 22nd, 2026 as Earth Day in Yolo County

WHEREAS, Earth Day is a day for uniting people around the world to celebrate the beauty of our planet and to promote environmental conservation, regeneration, and justice; and

WHEREAS, 2026 will mark 56 years since 20 million people across the United States commemorated the first Earth Day in 1970; and

WHEREAS, the impact and reach of Earth Day celebrations have grown into a worldwide effort to protect the Earth thanks to a combination of grassroots organizations, diligent action from citizens, and organization from every level of government; and

WHEREAS, global climate change, environmental degradation, mass extinction of species, and environmental injustice and inequality all pose major challenges all over the world, including right here in Yolo County; and

WHEREAS, the theme of Earth Day 2026 is “our power, our planet,” encouraging global cooperation and grassroots advocacy to achieve a more sustainable world; and

WHEREAS, the Yolo County Board of Supervisors adopted a resolution on the 29th day of September 2020 declaring a climate crisis in Yolo County and dedicating the county to pursuing an urgent and inclusive mobilization on climate; and

WHEREAS, the aforementioned resolution mandated the creation of the Yolo County Climate Action Commission to develop and propose a Climate Action Plan aimed at reducing greenhouse gas emissions and bringing Yolo County to a carbon negative footprint by 2030, among the most ambitious climate targets of any county in the State of California; and

WHEREAS, the Yolo County Climate Action and Adaptation Plan (CAAP) was passed by the Board of Supervisors in December of 2024; and

WHEREAS, Yolo County has centered environmental justice and public engagement in its approach to climate planning, including through the creation of working groups focused on equity and engagement, as well as public outreach efforts to ensure feedback from every community impacted by climate change and climate adaptation; and

WHEREAS, county staff have been working to implement actions from the CAAP through the county’s interdepartmental “Green Team,” supported by the county’s sustainability team and the Climate Action Commission. This year the county will be launching a dashboard where members of the public can track the county’s progress towards the CAAP.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Yolo County Board of Supervisors does hereby proclaim April 22nd, 2026, as Earth Day in Yolo County and reaffirms the County of Yolo’s commitment to sustainability and environmental protection.
