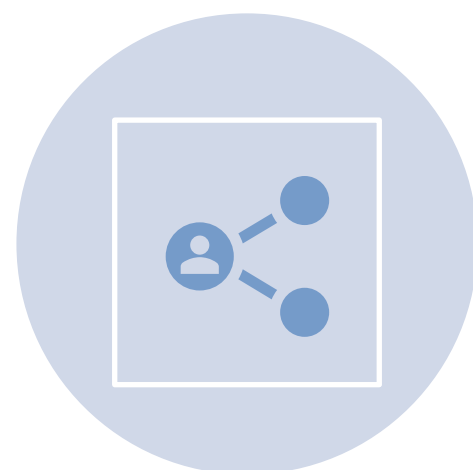

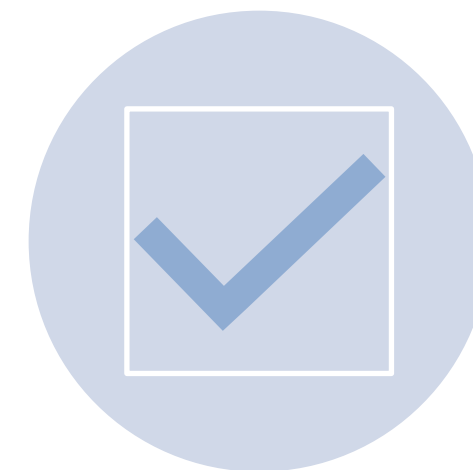

Follow-up Outreach Summary



Apartment Managers report no smoke-related complaints



Staff contacted all three properties



All have smoke-free leasing language



No concerns with potential county policy

Amending chapter 18 of title 6 of the yolo county code regarding smoking in and around multiunit residences



Add multiunit housing to the list of smoke-free areas



Covers smoking, vaping, and marijuana smoke



Will include smoking designated areas

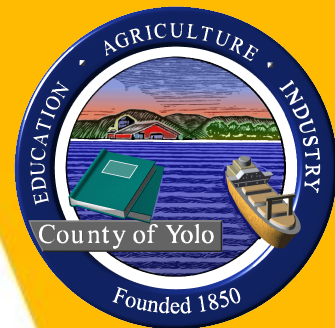
At least 3 written warnings
