REASON FOR RECOMMENDED ACTION

BACKGROUND

Marshall Nakatani is a Lead Political Organizer for UAW Local 4811, representing over 50,000 academic workers across all University of California campuses, including UC Davis. As part of UAW Region 6, which serves more than 125,000 members across diverse sectors such as manufacturing, civil service, and higher education, he supports efforts to expand clean manufacturing and renewable industries in California. As a delegate to the Sacramento Labor Council, Marshall brings experience in organizing, legislative knowledge of California's policymaking and budget process, and a strong understanding of workforce needs across multiple industries.

Appointment of Board members is based on Workforce Innovation Board (WIB) By-laws, supported by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act. Appointment of Workforce/Labor applicant, Marshall Nakatani is based on the Workforce Innovation Board By-law section 3.b) which states, "Not less than 20% of the WIB membership must be from the workforce of the local area, of which 15% must be from labor organizations. "Additionally, the term of appointment is based on WIB By-laws which state in section 8. a) "The term of office for each WIB members is four (4) years from the date of appointment by the Board of Supervisors."
