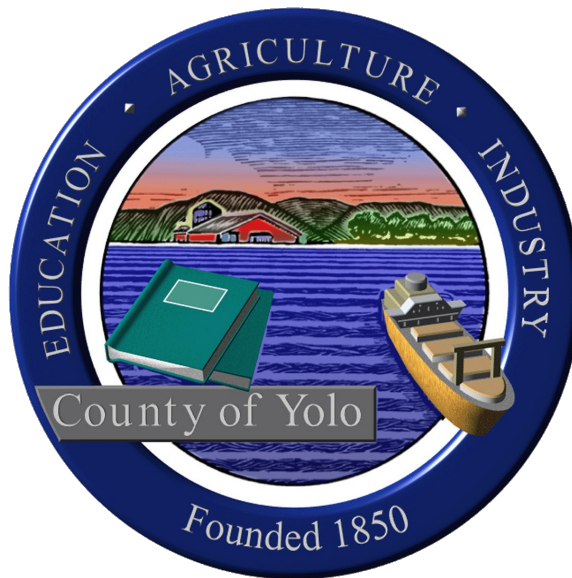

It was reported out from closed session that the Board of Supervisors, by a 5-0 vote, authorized County Counsel to initiate litigation. More information will be available after litigation has been filed.
