Property Tax Fairness Issue.	Budget Request	Seeking a correction to Yolo County’s longstanding property tax inequity.	Unsuccessful this session. Neither the permanent fix nor the one-time \$3 million request was included.
SB 1327 – EV charging equipment	Oppose	Would shift EV charging equipment oversight from local weights-and-measures agencies to the state.	Failed. Held in Senate Appropriations.
SB 1087 – Sustainable Communities Modernization	Support	Updates the Sustainable Communities Strategy framework and links planning to measurable results.	Passed Legislature. Awaiting Governor action.
AB 2474 – Statewide public alert platform	Oppose unless amended	Would mandate use of a statewide emergency alert software platform.	Failed. Hearing was canceled and the bill did not advance.
AB 2026 – Groundwater recharge permitting	Support	Streamlines permitting for groundwater recharge while maintaining water-right protections.	Failed. Held in Senate Appropriations.
AB 2443 – Carrier of Last Resort	Oppose	Would reduce existing requirements for basic telephone service.	Failed. Did not advance from Assembly committee.
SB 828 – Fireworks licensing and permits	Support	Strengthens fireworks licensing, permitting and local-government coordination.	Passed Legislature. Awaiting Governor action.

AB 2508 – Public Purpose Programs	Oppose	Would change the funding structure for energy efficiency and related public-purpose programs.	Failed. Held in Assembly Appropriations.
SB 1159 – People not Bots	Support	Protects public agencies from automated AI systems overwhelming public-participation processes.	Passed Legislature. Awaiting Governor action.
AB 2216 – Delta Conservancy Expansion	Support	Expands the Delta Conservancy to additional areas of Yolo and neighboring counties.	Failed. Held in Senate Appropriations.
AB 1549 – Domestic Violence Program	Support	Extends the domestic violence intervention pilot that includes Yolo County.	Signed by Governor.
AB 1607 – Maddy Emergency Medical Services Fund	Support	Extends funding that supports emergency care for uninsured patients.	Passed Legislature. Awaiting Governor action.
AB 1941 – Organized metal theft	Support	Creates a new organized metal theft offense and penalties for coordinated metal theft.	Passed Legislature. Awaiting Governor action.
IHSS budget proposals	Oppose	Opposed proposed IHSS cuts and cost shifts to counties.	Not adopted. The final budget rejected the proposed shift of IHSS costs to counties.

SB 872 – Protecting California’s Water	Support	Provides long-term funding for Delta levees, canals and other water infrastructure.	Passed Legislature. Awaiting Governor action.
AB 1643 – Child Support Program	Support	Seeks improvements to statewide child-support payment processing and coordination.	Failed. Held in Assembly Appropriations.
AB 762 – Battery-embedded vapor devices	Support	Prohibits specified disposable battery-embedded vapor devices.	Passed Legislature. Awaiting Governor action.
AB 871 – Financial abuse mandated reporting	Support	Expands mandated reporting of suspected financial abuse of elders and dependent adults.	Passed Legislature. Awaiting Governor action.
SB 226 – Infrastructure financing districts	Support	Addressed infrastructure revitalization financing districts before later amendments reduced County interest.	Passed Legislature. Governor action pending.
SB 1143 – Children’s advocacy center recordings	Support	Addresses use of recordings by children’s advocacy centers.	Signed by Governor.
SB 492 – Wildfire liability	Tracked Issue	Addressed utility-caused wildfire liability and wildfire prevention.	Failed. The final compromise removed the provisions opposed by local governments but did not receive enough votes to pass.

SB 577 – AB 218 / historic public- agency liability	Tracked Issue	Provides partial reforms related to historic public- agency liability and joint-and- several liability.	Passed Legislature. Awaiting Governor action.
AB 1761 – PCIA transparency	Tracked Issue	Would increase transparency in calculating the Power Charge Indifference Adjustment affecting CCA customers.	Passed Legislature. Awaiting Governor action.
