They work everyday to pay rent, and to pay for drugs, and the person working finds herself trapped in a story where a therapeutic exit becomes more dim and more dim. And obviously puts them at risk for copting into sex trafficking operations ran by prople.

There should be a story of beating addiction and reuniting with family. There should be a story of finding faith. A small minority might find that being an uncomplicated sex worker is a cushy story. But, especially with opiates, the stories that I've seen involve quiet desperation and acceptance of preventable degradation.

The public health workers should go to the sex workers directly. I am not one to suggest the details.

Just another thought.

PS: They are also humans with souls. They do not deserve abuse. To allow that does not glorify propriety, faithfulness, or decency. To allow that allows humans with bad intentions or misguided intentions a laboratory for trauma.
